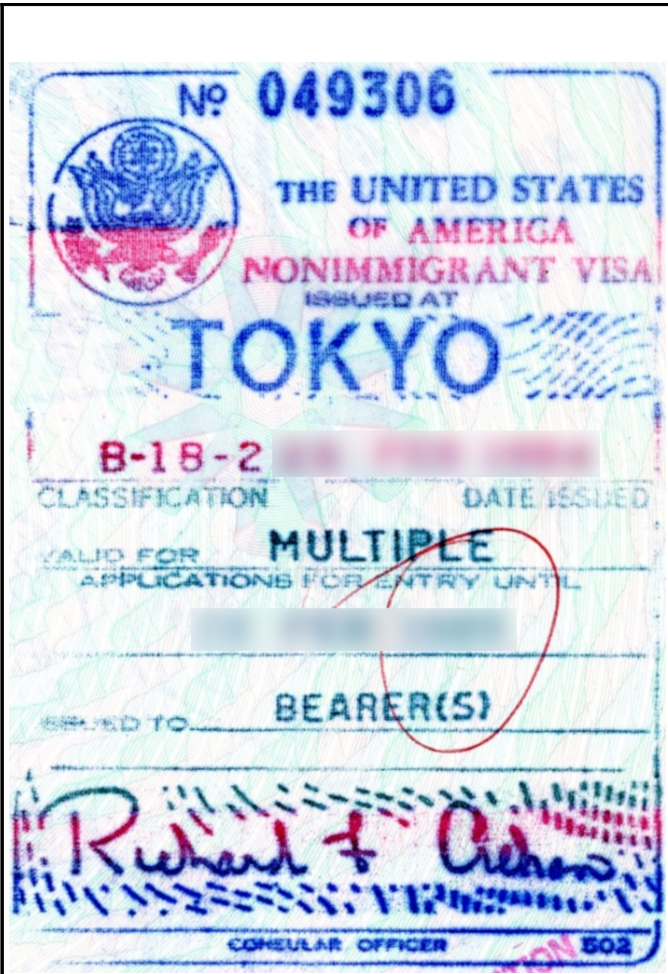

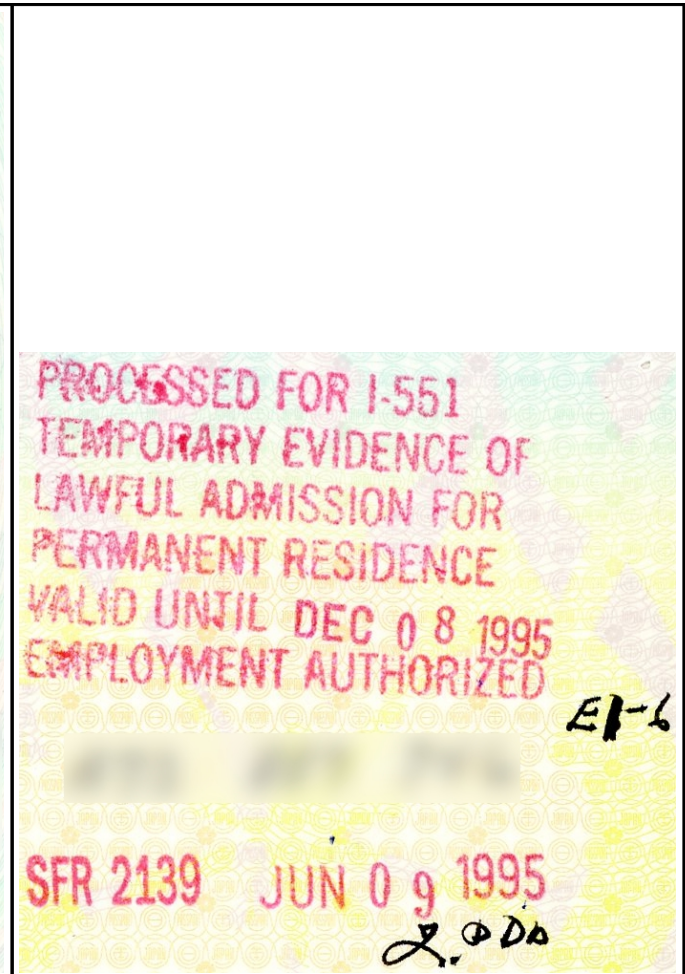

Baker & McKenzie attorney office promoted the application process. I met an attorney at Palo Alto office initially and San Francisco office next in addition to my office. INS must judge in 45 days for the first preference application. The fiscal year of INS starts from October, 1. Therefore, the first (left) document files were submitted on the October, 1 (10/1/1994). Then, I received the acceptance on 11/15/1994, 45 days later.

The permanent residency application process takes time to prepare and money as well. "National interest" is the key issue when INS examines.
